B. Two or three supporting sentences to give the reader some context and transition from hook to thesis. When writing about literature, include the title and author.

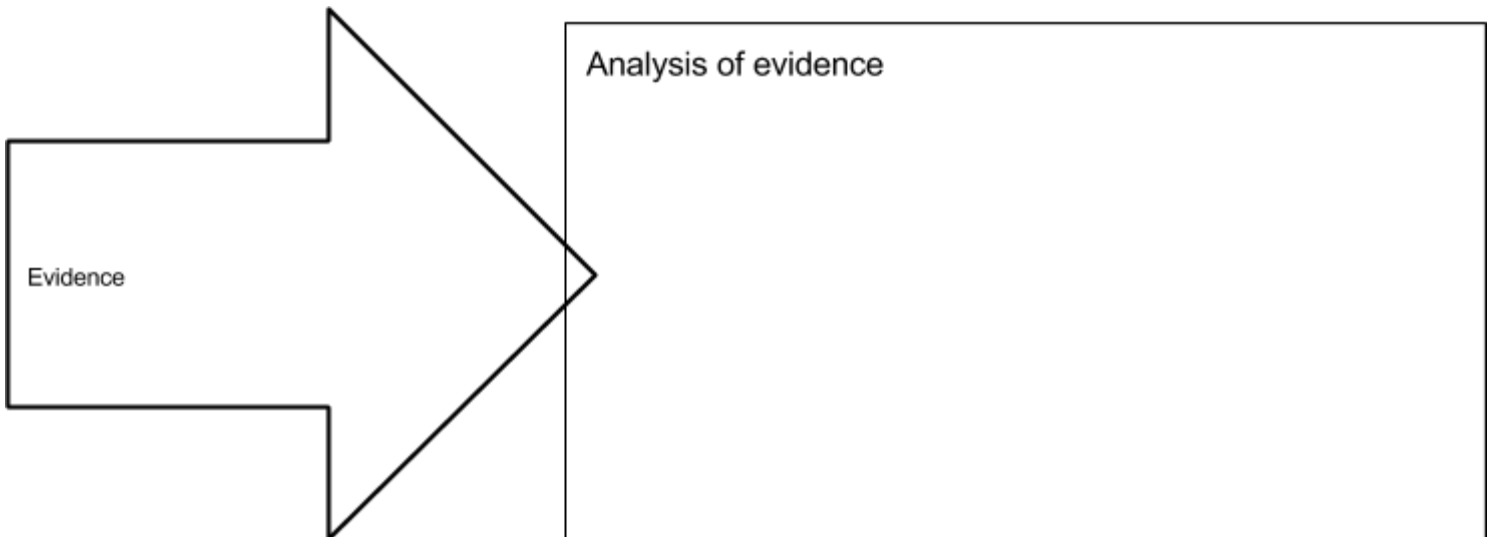
C. Thesis statement (what are you trying to prove/explain):

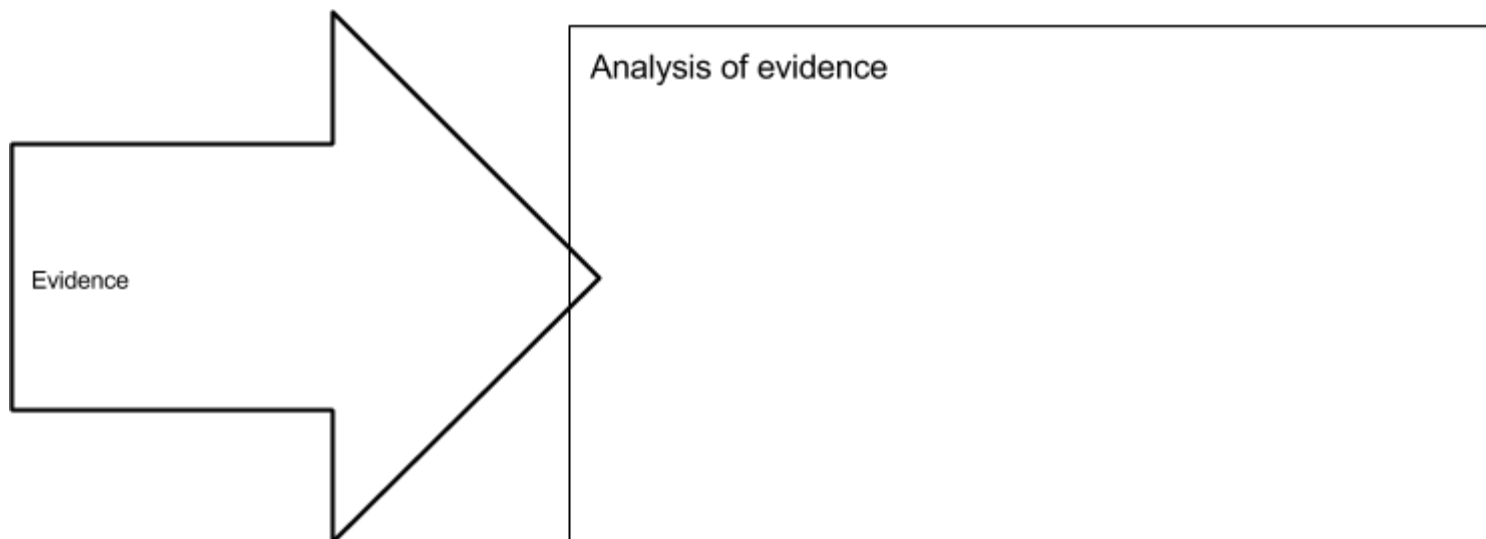
2. Body Paragraph One

Topic Sentence (main idea for paragraph)

Analysis of evidence

Concluding Sentence (restate main idea of paragraph & transition to next paragraph)

3. Concluding Paragraph

Restate your thesis (Do NOT use the same exact wording)

Summarize your evidence and analysis from your body paragraph(s)

An idea to end essay, such as

- how the text made you think differently about a subject OR
- possibly a solution OR
- text-to-world connection OR
- text-to-self connection
