**Meaning: not, lack of, the opposite**

Vocabulary Word & part of speech	Definition	Sentence Example
1. <b>uncertain</b> (adj)	Not sure; not able to be relied on; not known or definite	I was <b>uncertain</b> how to proceed with my homework.
2. <b>uncommon</b> (adj)	Rare; not the usual; out of the ordinary	The <b>uncommon</b> flower was picked as an example for the scientist's collection.
3. <b>unconscious</b> (adj)	Not within thought; not awake	The football player was knocked <b>unconscious</b> during the tackle.
4. <b>undecided</b> (adj)	Not yet at the point of making a decision; not settled or resolved	The winner of the tennis match was still <b>undecided</b> .
5. <b>unexpected</b> (adj)	Not what someone thought would happen	He seemed to have a knack for saying the <b>unexpected</b> .
6. <b>unmistakable</b> (adj)	Clear; cannot be understood the wrong way; very distinctive	The <b>unmistakable</b> sound of his laughter let me know my son was home.
7. <b>unnecessary</b> (adj)	Not required; more than is needed	Having three Burlington airports is <b>unnecessary</b> for our population size.
8. <b>untidy</b> (adj)	Messy; not neat and in order	My <b>untidy</b> room frustrated my parents.
9. <b>unwise</b> (adj)	Not smart; not wise or sensible; foolish	It is <b>unwise</b> to base your decision on gossip.
10. <b>unworthy</b>	Not deserving effort, attention, or respect; not having any value	He was <b>unworthy</b> of the public's trust to hold office.
