- 5. The goddess Ishtar wanted Gilgamesh for her husband and he refused! What were his reasons?
- 6. The Bull of Heaven apparently did some serious damage in Uruk. What natural disaster might this story be used to explain?

- 7. When Gilgamesh found out that the gods were striking down Enkidu, did he feel bad for Enkidu or himself? Support your answer with proof from the text.
- 8. As Enkidu lies sick and dying, what is his main concern? Why does he think he is cursed?
- 9. Why did the gods choose to kill Enkidu but spare Gilgamesh?

Tablet VIII

10. After reading Tablet VIII and the information below, describe what you will (or might) find in Enkidu's tomb and why it would be there.

Lapis lazuli and gold: According to the website SumerianShakespeare:
