MLA formatting:

To create a **header** which will be on each page:

- 1. Click on INSERT and find HEADER in the drop-down menu
 - a. Click on HEADER
 - i. Hit ENTER one time
 - 1. TAB over to the right-hand corner
 - a. Type in your LAST NAME
 - b. TAB again
 - i. Click on INSERT and find PAGE NUMBER in the drop-down menu
 - 1. Click on PAGE NUMBER until TOP OF PAGE appears
 - a. Click on TOP OF PAGE and consecutive page numbers will appear on every page of document
- 2. Move cursor to body of page to get out of header

To create first page of your paper

- 3. In the upper left-hand corner of the first page
 - a. list your name First and Last
 - b. your instructor's name Ms. Cassetty
 - c. the course and English _____
 - d. the due date: day / month / year

To create and write your title

- 4. Create an original title not the name of an article or book
- 5. Center the title by using the 'center align' button
- 6. Do not underline, italicize, or place your title in quotation marks; capitalize as needed but do NOT write it in all capital letters (EX: The Good, the Bad, and the Ugly)
- 7. Do not skip lines between title and beginning of paper

Additional information

- 8. Indent each paragraph
- 9. Do not skip lines between paragraphs
- 10. In text citations = (Author page)

EX: "The town used 512 gallons of water in 2014" (Smith 14).



To create a Works Cited page

- 1. The Works Cited page is the last page of your paper.
- 2. It is on a separate page but still has the same header.
- 3. The title of the page Works Cited should be centered using the 'center align' button
 - a. Do not underline, italicize, or place your title in quotation marks.
- 4. Double space entries but do NOT skip lines between entries.
- 5. Each entry should be in the format of a 'hanging indent.'
- 6. To create a 'hanging indent' hit ENTER at the end of the first line
 - a. then TAB (as you do for an indent) for remaining lines of entry.
- 7. Entries should be listed alphabetically by the first word in the entry.
- 8. The first word in the entry should match what is given in your in-text citation so that readers can identify the source easily.

EXAMPLE:

Cory, Scandy. "Society Lost Without a Moral Compass to Kill a Mockingbird by Cory Scandy."
